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## SAFETY AND PRECAUTIONS

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before use. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given recent studies, which show that using a mobile telephone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile telephone when the vehicle is not parked.

Your mobile phone when powered emits radiation which may interfere with the vehicle electronic systems such as anti-lock brakes (ABS, airbag). As a result, you should:

- avoid placing the phone on the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area.
- connect the phone to an external antenna or switch the phone off. The antenna should be mounted and located away from the driver and passengers or separated from them by a metal screen (e.g. the car roof).
- check with the car manufacturer or your car dealer that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

**Switch the phone off** before boarding an aircraft to avoid prosecution.

**Switch the phone off** when you are in health care facilities, except

in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency. When the phone is switched on, avoid placing it near a medical aid device, if you carry one, such as a pacemaker, one hearing aid or insulin pump. When using the phone you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

**Switch the phone off** when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, gas station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere. Do not let small children use the phone without supervision. Do not attempt to open or repair it yourself. Use only Alcatel batteries, battery chargers, and accessories that are compatible with your phone model. (See Accessories List, chapter 17). Alcatel will not be held responsible if this is not respected. Do not allow your phone to be exposed to unfavourable environmental conditions (humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is  $-20^{\circ}\text{C}$  to  $+40^{\circ}\text{C}$ . Over  $55^{\circ}\text{C}$  the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

#### • BATTERY:

Before removing the battery from your phone, please make sure that the phone is switched off. Take precautions with the battery and do not attempt to open the battery (chemical substances may cause burns). Do not pierce, disassemble nor cause a short-circuit in a battery. Do not burn or dispose of a used battery in household waste or store it at temperatures above  $60^{\circ}\text{C}$ . Batteries must be disposed of in accordance with locally applicable environmental legislation. Batteries should not be used for any other purpose than the one intended. Never use damaged batteries.

#### • CHARGERS

Mains powered chargers will operate within the temperature range:  $0$  to  $40^{\circ}\text{C}$ . The chargers designed for your mobile phone meet with the standard for safety of information technology equipment and office equipment use. They should be used for this purpose only.

#### • RADIO WAVES:

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with the International guidelines (ICNIRP) or European Directive 1999/5/EC (R&TTE) must be shown. The protection of the health and the safety for the user and any other person constitute an essential element of these guidelines or this directive.

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy recommended by International guidelines (ICNIRP) (1) and by the Council of the European Union (Recommendation 1999/519/EC) (2). These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines were developed by

independent scientific organisations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The limits include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the **Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR**. The SAR limit stated in the International guidelines or recommended by the Council of the European Union is **2 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over 10 grams of body tissue**. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station antenna, the lower the power output of the phone.

The highest tested SAR value for this mobile phone for use at the ear and compliance against the standard is 0.43 W/kg. While there may be differences between the SAR levels on various phones and at various positions, they all meet the relevant International guidelines and EU requirements for RF exposure.

Your telephone is equipped with a built-in antenna. For optimal operation, you should avoid touching it or degrading it.

The World Health Organization (WHO) considers that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for use of mobile phones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using "hands-free" devices to keep mobile phones away from the head and body." 

## GETTING STARTED

### 2.1 SIM Card and battery

#### Inserting and removing the SIM card (1)

You must insert a SIM card in order to use your phone.



Fit SIM card with the chip facing downwards


Slide the SIM card into its compartment. Check that it is properly inserted




Push the SIM card with your finger to release it

**!** (1) The telephone is compatible with 3 V, 3/5V, and 1.8/3 V SIM cards. Former 5 V SIM cards can no longer be used. Contact your operator.





## Charging the battery

The on-screen indicator stops flashing when charging is over



Disconnect the battery charger once charging is complete

- A short beep will sound when charging begins.
- The charging indicator icon may take several minutes to start to flash if your battery is new or very low.
- The mains socket outlet must be close to the phone and easily accessible.



**Use exclusively Alcatel chargers that are compatible with your phone model.**

When you first use your phone you must charge the battery for approximately 3 hours.

For optimal backlighting, your battery must be fully charged.

## 2.2 Switching your phone on



Switch your phone on (long keypress)

Enter your PIN code if you are prompted to

If you are prompted to enter the time and date, enter the new data if necessary, then confirm by .

If cell broadcast messages are displayed, use the key to browse through them in full or press the key to return to the main screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, <<<<->>> is displayed. (??-?? is displayed if your SIM card is rejected by the network, in this case please contact your operator).

## 2.3 Switching your phone off


From the main screen, press the key (long keypress).

If you do not know your PIN code, please contact your network operator.

Do not leave your PIN code near your phone and store your card in a safe place when you are not using it.

# 3 CALLS

## 3.1 Making a call



! If you make a mistake, you can delete digits by pressing the key.

To enter characters "+" or "P" (pause), make a long keypress on (the following characters scroll: 0, +, •, P).

**To make an emergency call**, if your telephone is within the area covered by a network, dial 112 or the emergency number provided by your operator.

**To make an international call:**



You may find the country's or the area's name by pressing the key associated with the first character of its name.

Once the **"Country/area"** code is displayed, dial the rest of the number and make the call.

## 3.2 Calling your voice mail

Your voice mail works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

Access the voice mail with a long keypress on , the screen will then display the message **"Call?"**, confirm by pressing or press to make the call.

! To use your voice mail abroad, contact your operator before leaving.

If your operator's voice mail access number is not shown, dial the number that was supplied to you with your subscription. To later modify this number, use the **"Numbers"** MENU option. (See page 57)

## 3.3 Receiving a call

When receiving a call, answer by pressing , speak, then hang up by pressing .

! The caller's number is displayed if it was transmitted by the network (check the availability of this service with your operator).

 the vibrator is activated: the telephone will not ring.

 the vibrator and ring tone are switched off.

To switch off the ring tone, press  when the telephone rings. You can take a call by pressing . If you press  again, the call will be rejected.

### 3.4 Options available while calling

**Volume** Increase or decrease the sound level

**Handsfree** Activate/deactivate the handsfree mode (the  symbol is then replaced by )

**Caution:** move the handset away from your ear before activating this mode because the amplified volume could cause hearing damage

**Hold call (1)** Place an ongoing call on hold (you can later resume the call by pressing the  key)

**Dial (1)** Make a second call (an ongoing call will be automatically put on hold and you can switch between calls by pressing the  key)

 **Save Number** Store a phone number in one of your directories: SIM or Product (Mobile)

**!** (1) Check the availability of this service with your operator.

**Directory** Access the directory

**Messages** Read your messages

**Services (1)** Access the services supported by your network operator

**Back** Return to the previous screen

### Handling a second incoming call (1)

A beep will inform you of a second incoming call.

If you accept the new call by pressing the  key, the ongoing call is automatically put on hold; you can then swap between the calls by pressing the  key and then the  key.

To refuse the second call, press the  key twice.



**!** (1) Check the availability of this service with your operator.

## Conference calls (1)

Your telephone allows you to converse with several persons at the same time.



The conference starts

### • A third call comes in



! (1) Check the availability of this service with your operator.



Pressing the key hangs up the communication you had with the correspondent you have selected.

To end the conference call, click on the key and select the **"End Conf. Call"** option.

## 3.5 Double line management (1)

Your SIM card can contain two lines with two different phone numbers.

By default, you are automatically on line 1. To switch from line 1 to line 2, open **"Menu/Setup/Double line/Line choice"** (1).

Whichever line is selected (1 or 2) you can receive calls intended for both lines.

Calls made will be invoiced on the selected line.

! During a call, you can use the key to adjust the volume.

(1) Check the availability of this service with your operator.

# 4 CALL MEMORY

## Using available options

To access the call memory, press , the screen will display the last numbers called preceded by the following symbols:

-  = Answered incoming call.
-  = Unanswered incoming call.
-  = Outgoing call.

Select the number you want by pressing  then press  to make the call.





### Messages (SMS):

Read, write and send your short messages.



### My setup:

Customise your ring tones, icons, On/Off and main screens, your direct dial numbers, your keypad and prefixes and the colour background of the menu display.



(1) Depending on your model, the language and availability of this service with your operator.



### Game:

Access the game proposed.



### My tribe:

Access an instant messaging WAP site (1).



### Alarms:

Set your telephone's alarms (appointments, birthdays, wake-up).



### Calculator/Converter:

Perform currency conversions (Euros/currencies, etc.) and basic calculations.



### Setup:

Set up your telephone (displays, formats, etc.) and take advantage of the features provided by your operator (security, call forwarding, etc.).

You can customise your main MENU by changing the order of the options. For example, you can choose to display **“Sounds”** at the beginning of your Menu: select this option, make a long keypress on the  key to place it in the first position in your new list. The  icon is displayed after the selected option.

To cancel this duplicated item, select it in the list and make a long keypress on the  key.

## DIRECTORIES

### 7.1

### Accessing your directories

- Access directories from the main screen by pressing  downwards.
- Or from the MENU (cf. page 26) by pressing  then selecting "Directory".



To search for the name you are looking for

Two directories are available, the SIM  directory and the product  directory (Mobile).

For easy consultation, all your contacts are stored in a joint list.

The icon displayed in front of a name indicates whether the name belongs to the SIM directory or to the Mobile's:



SIM directory



Product directory (Mobile).

## Searching for a name by its first letter

You can also search for the name of the person you wish to contact by pressing the key associated with the first letter of his/her name.

Example: Press the  key twice to find the first name beginning with “B”, then scroll the list to the name you are looking for using the  key. In some languages, depending on the input mode, this search is performed using the “Search name” option. (See page 34)


## Calling from the directory

You can assign 3 different numbers to the same name: Home, Mobile, Office (see page 32). If you want to call a party who has several numbers, first you must choose the number you wish in the list.



## 7.2 Creating a directory file

If your directories are empty, the “**Directory empty! Create a file!**” message will be displayed.


From the list of names in your directories, press the  key to create a file.



Each name in a directory can have up to 3 numbers: Home, Mobile, Office.

Files created in the SIM directory can be consulted from a different mobile phone.

**!** If you use your telephone abroad, you should store the numbers in the directory in the international format with the “+” prefix. (See page 19)



Switch from one to another by pressing the  key or  key.

**!** You do not have to fill in all the information, but at least one number must be entered for each name.

Up to 250 phone numbers can be stored in the product directory. The SIM directory's capacity depends on the operator.

### 7.3 Classifying a file in a family

To differentiate your files, you can classify them in groups called “families”: Private , Profession. , Other , or None. A different ring tone can be assigned to each family. This classification will allow you to easily distinguish a professional call from a private call (1). It is possible to screen incoming calls by family. (See pages 73, 74)

The files you created may be organised in alphabetical order, by family (Private , Profession. , Other , or None) or by directory (SIM then Mobile). (See page 32)

**!** (1) If the caller's number is displayed.

### 7.4 Available options

From the list of names in your directory, you can access the following options by pressing the  key:



### Copying from one directory to another

You can copy a file or all the contents of a directory to another. You may choose to keep or to delete the original directory or file.



### 7.5 Assigning a ring tone to a family

You can assign a ring tone to a family, so when you receive a call from a contact classified in a particular family, the ring tone for the incoming call will be the one assigned to that family. An icon is also assigned to each family, allowing you to easily recognise your correspondent's family. (See page 33)

### 7.6 Temporary SIM card

When you create a file, you can include 3 different numbers (Home, Mobile, Office).

If you change your SIM card, an information message will be displayed when the telephone is switched on. You must then decide if this card will become your main SIM card or if it is being inserted temporarily:




- Keypress on **(C)**: the SIM card you just inserted becomes your main card. You can create the files with up to three numbers (Home, Mobile, Office). If you reinsert your old SIM card, you will no longer find the three numbers that were formerly associated with the same name.
- Keypress on **OK**: the SIM you just inserted is considered as "Temporary". You will be able to create or modify files with one number only. If you then reinsert the first card (your main card), you will find the three number association it originally contained.

# 8 MESSAGES (I)

## 8.1 Accessing messages

- Make a keypress upwards on the  key from the main screen.
- Or press the  key from the MENU (see page 26) and select “Messages”.

## 8.2 Reading your messages

The messages will be automatically stored on your SIM card directory, but you can store them in your telephone's memory by selecting the “**Archive**” option.

### “Unread” messages

When a new message is received, a screen message “**Do you want to read your new messages?**” and the  icon are displayed and an audible signal (1) is emitted.

The  icon disappears when all new “**Events**” (messages, calls, ...) have been consulted.

#### • Read immediately

If you want to read immediately the messages, press the  key.



- (1) To deactivate the audible signal (see page 50).

## • Read later

If you want to read your messages later, press the  key.



**!** The capacity of your SIM card depends on your operator. The  icon is displayed when there are too many stored messages: please delete some.

## Available options

While reading a message, you can access the following options using the  key:

-  **Delete** Delete the selected message
-  **Answer** Write a message in reply to a message you received
-  **Forward (1)** Forward the selected message after modifying the recipient's name or the parameters
-  **Archive** Save from your SIM card to the telephone memory
-  **Save Number** Store the original message number or the destination number in the directory
-  **Save icon (2)** Store an icon in the list of icons
-  **Save Animation (2)** Store an animation in the list of animations
-  **Save sound (2)** Store a sound in the list of sounds
-   **Save canned (1)** Store this message as a canned message

- !**
- (1) Except protected objects (sounds, images).
  - (2) If the received message contains sounds, images, icons, animations.

### Parameters

Update the following parameters:

**Serv. Centre:** your operator's service centre number (may be provided automatically)

**E-mail centre (1):** calling number for sending an e-mail (can be automatically presented to you)

**Format:** in which the message is to be delivered to your correspondent (SMS, e-mail, fax, etc.)

**Validity:** time during which the network presents the message again to your recipient in case of unsuccessful delivery

**Receipt:** activate/deactivate the acknowledgement receipt request

### Zoom

Change the character size (2)

### Back

Return to the current message

### “Read/Saved” messages

These messages can be read messages, written messages which are sent or not sent, or messages that are stored on the SIM card.



- (1) Check the availability of this service with your operator.
- (2) Depending on the language.

### Received:

All messages that you received, read, and stored.

Your friends can send you messages containing icons, animations, mood icons, sounds, and texts. When you receive those messages, you may also store these objects so that you can use them later.

If a message contains several icons, sounds, or animations, select the object using the key and confirm with the key.

You can call one of the numbers that appears in a message you have received by pressing .

### To send:

All written and not yet sent messages.

### Sent:

All written, sent and stored messages.

If “Receipt” was activated in the “Parameters” option, when you view the sent messages, the following symbols are displayed:



Message sent in expectation of an acknowledgement receipt.



Message sent and acknowledgement received.



Message unsuccessfully delivered (in this case you should send the message again).

### “Archived” messages

These messages can be read or written messages that you have sent from the SIM card memory to the telephone memory. You can save up to 30 messages in your telephone memory.

Archived messages are classified in three groups: Received, To send, Sent.

### 8.3 Writing a message

- Make a keypress upwards on the  key from the main screen.
- Or press the  key from the MENU (see page 26) and select “Messages”.

You can create a message or amend a stored message.

You can create a message with text only but can also assign icons or sounds, or mood icons (See page 47)



The shape of the cursor will tell you whether you are in:  
 - predictive mode  (data entry system, see page 45) or  
 - normal mode 

**To switch from one mode to the other, make a long keypress on the  key.**

While writing the message, depending on the selected entry mode, you can access the following options by pressing the  key.

**!** The underlined options (see page 44) will be displayed only in the predictive mode.

## 8.4 Data entry system (1): predictive mode

Notwithstanding any other applicable statutory warranties, this mobile phone is guaranteed against any manufacturing defect for a period of ONE (1) year from the date of purchase shown on your invoice. Nevertheless if the statutory warranty in force in your country exceeds one (1) year, the statutory warranty is not affected by the manufacturer's warranty.

The present warranty terms also apply to the battery and accessories but for a period of SIX (6) months from the date of purchase shown on your invoice. Under the terms of this warranty, you must inform your dealer or any maintenance centre (see list of maintenance centres at our website - [www.alcatel.com](http://www.alcatel.com)) without delay, of any defect and present the invoice given to you at the time of purchase.

The dealer will decide whether to replace or repair, as appropriate, all or any part of the equipment (telephone or accessory) found to be defective. This warranty covers the cost of parts and labour but excludes any other costs. Repair or replacement may be carried out using reconditioned components offering equivalent functionality.

**!** (I) Depending on your phone model and availability.

## TROUBLESHOOTING

We recommend that you carry out the following checks before contacting the Customer Care Service:

**My mobile phone will not switch on**

- Press the  key for at least two seconds
- Check your battery charge level

**The <<< >>>> symbol is displayed: my mobile phone is not connected to a network:**

- Try to reach the network by moving to a different location (if you are inside a building, stay near a window)
- Check your mobile coverage with your operator
- Make sure your SIM card is valid by checking with your operator

**SIM card error**

- Make sure the SIM card is correctly inserted
- Check with your operator that your SIM card is 3V compatible, former 5V SIM cards can no longer be used

**Outcoming calls cannot be made or no incoming calls are received**

- Make sure your mobile phone is connected to the network
- Check your subscription with your operator (credit, SIM card validity)

**I cannot create a file in my directory**

- Check that the directory is not full, delete some files

**I cannot access my voice mail**

- Make sure that your voicemail number is stored in the **“Numbers”** option

**I cannot send messages**

- Check the service centre number with your operator
- Your correspondent's phone could be incompatible with the transmission mode you are using (EMS standard for any transmission of icons, sounds,...)
- Check that your short message memory is not full

**The main screen displays a black envelope icon**

- Too many short messages are stored in your SIM memory, delete some!

**I have already entered 3 incorrect PIN codes**

- Contact your operator to get your PUK code to unblock your mobile

The  icon is still showing

- Go to **“Menu/Events”** and check all events

I cannot save my new downloaded items

- Delete old downloaded items by going to **“Menu/My setup/Downloaded”**

I have plugged in the charger, but:  
-the charging indicator is not displayed

-The charging indicator may take several minutes to start to flash if the battery is very low. Please wait a few minutes and the telephone will start charging again normally

- the charge icon is displayed, but the animation does not start

- Remove your telephone battery then reinsert it and the telephone will start charging again normally
