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## Safety and Use .....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained in this manual.

#### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given recent studies, which show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area.
- connect your phone to an external antenna or switch your phone off. The antenna must be mounted and located away from passengers or separated from them by a metal screen (e.g. car roof).
- check with your dealer or car manufacturer to make sure that the car electronics is well insulated.

#### CONDITIONS OF USE:

Switch off the phone before boarding an aircraft to avoid prosecution.

Switch off the phone when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile phones can interfere with the operation of other electric, electronic or radio frequency devices in their vicinity.

# Getting started .....

## 2.1 Set-up

#### Inserting and removing the SIM card (1)

You must insert your SIM card in order to use your phone.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted.

#### Installing and removing the battery

## 2.2 Switching on your telephone

Make a long keypress on the  $\subset$  key until the telephone comes on, type in your PIN code if necessary and then confirm with the OK key. The main screen is displayed.



If you don't know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code near your telephone and store your card in a safe place when not in use.

If cell broadcast messages are displayed, use the OK key to browse through them in full or press the  $\subset$  key to return to the main screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, the <<<->>> symbol is displayed (???-??? is displayed if your SIM card is rejected by the network, in this case please contact your operator).

### 2.3 Switching off your telephone

Press the  $\subseteq$  key from the main screen (long keypress).

#### 3. Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the  $\{1\}$  key to place the call. To hang up, press the same key again. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the  $\subset$  key.



To enter characters "+" or "P" (pause), make a long keypress on the  $\odot$  key (the following characters will scroll by: 0, +, P, •).

#### Making an emergency call

If your phone is covered by the network, dial 112 and press the 🕴 key to make an emergency call (or any other number provided by your operator). This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code or unblocking the keypad.

#### Making a call with a prefix

Access "Prefix" by making a long keypress on O and stop when you see the "+" sign. To access the various prefixes, use the **I** key.

- To make an international call, press + (2), and when you have confirmed the country and area codes, finish dialling the number and send the call.
- If you already know the prefix you want, you can go directly to the 🗒 icon and enter the prefix directly followed by the number of the person you are calling.
- In some companies, telephone numbers all begin with the same digits. By using the "**Prefix**" feature , you can memorise the shared digits but you will need to enter the variable part. You must create the prefixes yourself.



#### Automatic redial

If this feature is activated and supported by the network (see page 50), the person you called will be called back automatically if you are unable to reach him/her.

## 3.2 Calling your voice mail (1)

Your voice mail is provided by your network so that you don't miss any calls: it works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time. To access your voice mail, make a long keypress on the  $(m_{e})$  key, then send the call using the OK key.

If the access number for your operator's voice mail service does not appear, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to "**My numbers**" (see page 47).

To use your voice mail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

## **3.3 Receiving a call**

When you receive an incoming call, press the  $\{i\}$  key to talk and then hang up using the same key.

When you have an incoming call, your telephone rings quietly at first and then gets louder. If the B icon is displayed, the vibrator is activated: no ringtone. If the  $\swarrow$  icon is displayed, the phone neither rings nor vibrates.

The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

#### **Muting the ringtone**

Press  $\subset$  or use the navigation key to scroll to the left icon while the telephone is ringing: answer the call pressing the  $\{\}$  key.

#### Rejecting a call

Press the C key twice or scroll to the  $\mathbb{B}^{\prime}$  icon to refuse the call indefinitely.

#### **3.4 During the call**

#### **Available functions**

During a call, you can use your directory, your diary, short messages, etc. without losing your correspondent by pressing the **4** key.

## Handling two calls

#### • Call waiting (1)

If a second call comes in while you are already on line, you will be notified by a tone. You can then accept the call by pressing the  $\{\}$  key.

Your current call will be automatically put on hold. You can then switch between your two correspondents using the  $\triangleleft \triangleright$  key and then OK.

#### Making a second call

To call a second party during a call, press the OK key and select "Dial".

### 3.5 Conference calls (1)

Your phone allows you to talk with several people at the same time (up to 5). You are on a double call: press OK, select "**Conference**" then confirm with the OK key. If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing the  $\{\}$  key and speak with your new correspondent.

This correspondent becomes a member of the conference if you press OK, select "Add conf.", and then confirm by pressing OK. Pressing {} disconnects the current call.

To end the conference call, press OK and select "End conf.".

## **3.6** Double line <sup>(1)</sup>

Your SIM card can contain two distinct telephone numbers. Under "**Tools**", choose "**Double line**" and then select a default line; all your outgoing calls will be made from this number. Incoming calls, however, will continue to use the two lines (see page 54).

## 4.1 Consulting the call memory and calling back

You can access your call memory by pressing the {} key from the main screen. You must first choose the appropriate icon:

## **6.** Consulting your directory

To access the **directory** from the main screen, press the bottom of the  $\Rightarrow$  key or press the  $^{OK}$  key and select the  $\bigotimes$  icon from the menu.

#### You have 4 directories:

**SIM** directory:

The SIM card's capacity depends on your operator. It is not possible to assign more than one number to a name.

#### General directory:

Contains all files created. The SIM card files are not created automatically in the general directory, but they can be copied to it.

#### Personal directory:

You can store your personal contacts in this directory (relatives, friends, etc.).

Professional directory: You can store your professional contacts in this directory (companies, etc.).

In addition to the directories already provided, you can create your own directories (see page 26).

#### Searching for a name by its first letter

You can search for the person's name by pressing the key associated with the first letter of his/her name.

For some languages that have a specific entry mode, you should use the "Search name" option.

#### Read a file

Select a name from your directory and confirm with the OK key. Select "View" and confirm.

#### Making the call

Press the  $\{\}$  key when the name is selected. If several numbers are associated with the name to be called, you must first choose the number from the list (Home, Mobile, Office, etc.) using the  $\Rightarrow$  key. Press the  $\{\}$  key to make the call.



Information in the directory and the diary may be sent to and received from a computer using the Alcatel PC software package (see page 86).

## 6.2 Creating a file

Select the directory in which you wish to create a file. From the list of names in your directory, press the OK key, select "**Create file**" then OK.

You can save the data you have entered at any time by pressing the OK key and choosing "Save & Quit". You can go to the following field by selecting "Continue" or by using the navigation key  $\triangleq$ .

When you create a new contact in the product directory, at least one of the following fields must be filled in:  $\square$  Identity card,  $\square$  Numbers,  $\bigcirc$  E-mail,  $\square$  Address,  $\square$  Notes,  $\square$  Perso. If you use your phone abroad, store the numbers in your directories in international format "+" (see page 16).

## 6.4 Creating a new directory

From the product directory, press **OK** and select "**Create dir.**", confirm using the **OK** key, then name your new directory. You can create up to 13 new directories.

You can delete only those directories that you created by selecting "Delete dir."

## 6.5 Classifying files

From a product directory, press the OK key and select "**Classify file**", confirm using the OK key, choose the destination directory, press the OK key and select "**Validate**".

## 6.6 Using voice recognition

Voice recognition allows you to place your call by pronouncing the party's name without using your directory.

#### Recording a voice recognition command

Select a file from the product directory and confirm using the OK key. Then select "Voice recog." and confirm once again. Three different beeps will signal the start of recording, its failure or its success. After recording, you can "Listen to", "Replace" or "Delete" a recorded voice recognition command.

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The files for which a voice recognition command has been recorded are indicated by the 4<sup>t</sup> icon. The number of names accessible through voice recognition is limited. This feature can be used in all directories except the SIM card directory.

#### **Voice recognition**

You can activate voice recognition by a long keypress on the  $\{\}$  key from the main screen. Follow the instructions on the screen.

## 6.7 Assigning a ringtone to a directory

Select a file from the product directory, press OK and select "Dir. melody"

When you receive a call from a party classified in the product directory, the ringtone will be the one assigned to that directory.

## 6.8 Assigning an image or an animation to a file

Select a file from the product directory, press **OK** and select "**Assign image**". You can then assign a picture or an animation to a file.

When you receive a call, the picture or animation that you have chosen will be displayed on the screen.

#### 7. Accessing messages

From your telephone, you can read, write, send and receive short messages "Text/SMS" and "Multimedia/MMS" and share them with other mobiles <sup>(1)</sup>. Multimedia messages are messages whereby you can send images, photos, animations, sounds, voice messages, appointments or directory files to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses. You have a function "Vox MMS". This is a simplified MMS that allows you to send a voice memo as a message.

The multimedia MMS function can only be used if: 1) the service is proposed by your operator, 2) if your contract includes the MMS option, 3) all the parameters for sending MMS have been entered (see page 39).

To access the **messages** from the main screen, press the top of the  $\blacklozenge$  key or press the **OK** key and select "**Messages**" with the navigation key and confirm with the **OK** key.

Your "Messages" menu may be compared to a letter box: using the navigation key, choose the icon you want:

- Inbox: View messages received: read/unread/archived.
- Create message: Create a new message (SMS/MMS/Vox MMS).
- Outbox: View sent and unsent messages.
- 🖳 Sending parameters: Perform your settings.

When **viewing** your messages, you will find the following status icons, depending on:

- the type of message: 📄 SMS message, 🚯 MMS message, 🛃 MMS notification, 🚖 MMS sending in progress, 🎝 MMS message with a sound.
- where your message is stored: 🚎 messages stored on your SIM card (SMS only), 🖃 messages stored in the phone's memory (MMS notifications).

#### 7.2 Viewing messages

When a new SMS arrives, the following message is displayed: "**Read your new messages?**", a beep sounds  $^{(i)}$  and the  $\mathbb{R}$  icon shows up.

#### 7.2.1 Viewing short messages "Text/SMS"

If you only have one new message, press OK to read it directly from the main screen. If you have several new messages, you can access a list. Select the appropriate message by scrolling with the navigation key then press OK. Read the whole message scrolling with the navigation key  $\blacklozenge$ .

When you receive a message, you can decide whether or not to save the pictures, sounds or text for later use.

You have two ways of managing the reception of MMS: immediate or deferred reception. Confirm your choice from "Sending param." section in the "Messages" menu (see page 39).

"Immediate reception": when in idle mode, the initial indicate that a new message is being downloaded. Then the message "Read your new messages?" appears. Press OK to go to the message options and select "Open". The contents of this message will be automatically stored in the memory of your telephone. Using the appropriate options you can record images, sounds or texts contained in the messages and use them later.

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 "Deferred reception": You will receive a notification with the name and number of the sender and the title of the message if it has been saved. ## 7.3 Writing and sending short messages ("Text/SMS")

#### 7.3.1 Writing short messages (SMS)

Go to the "**Create message**" menu, if necessary, from the "**Messages**" function. Select "**Text/SMS**" and press **OK**. You can modify a predefined message or create a new message.

#### Pictures, sounds, mood icons

You can customise your messages by adding pictures and sounds or express how you are feeling by using the mood icons proposed in your telephone.

You can also enter your own mood icons using the alphanumeric characters: example ":-)".

By selecting "**Preview**", you can view the contents of your completed message. The icons, sounds and mood icons appear on your telephone screen.

<sup>(1)</sup> - For one object press **OK** to save.

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<sup>-</sup> For several objects press "**Options**", choose the objects one by one using the option "**Next**", and press **OK** to save.



The inserted mood icon, icon or sound is represented by the  $\square$ ,  $\square$  or  $\square$  symbol.

You can enhance your telephone by downloading new sounds and images over WAP (see page 86).

The person receiving the message must be equipped with an EMS compatible mobile phone in order to display the icons and mood icons and listen to the sounds contained in your message.



A message of more than 160 characters, or a message containing icons, sounds, or mood icons may be billed as more than one message. Check with your operator.

#### 7.3.2 Sending an SMS

You can send a message:

- · Manually by entering the number of the recipient.
- To a person whose contact is stored in one of your directories.
- To several different people by specifying a distribution list (choose the "Distribution list" option).
- To a group of people that you have pre-set.
- To an e-mail address that can be entered or copied directly from your directory (1).

If the "Ack. receipt" feature is activated in "Parameters", when you consult your sent messages, the following symbols will indicate:

- Msg.ack.: message sent and acknowledgment received V -
- Msg.not received: message sent and waiting for acknowledgement of receipt or message not X received. You should send the message again.
- 7.4 Writing and sending multimedia messages ("Multimedia/MMS")
- 7.4.1 Writing a multimedia message (MMS)

Go to the "Create message" menu, if necessary, from the "Messages" function. Select "Multimedia/MMS" and press OK.

<sup>(I)</sup> Depending on your operator.

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This message may contain several pages without exceeding the maximum memory allocated <sup>(1)</sup>. As you create your MMS, you will be informed of the memory used (for all pages).

Each page may only contain a single item of each type. If you wish to add an object, you will have to create a new page. For example: to send 3 images in the same MMS, you will have to create 3 pages.

You may also send files from your directory (Vcard) or appointments (Vcal) to be attached to the MMS and which will be displayed in a separate page.

Select one of the following options with the OK key to create your MMS as you go along.

While creating your MMS, you can switch between the pages using the **4** key.

You will be able to modify or delete an item or page, save your message in order to come back to it later.

#### 7.4.2 Send an MMS

You can send an MMS to a person by dialling the number or via the directory. You can also send one to a group of people (see page 40) or to an e-mail address.

You can also reply to an MMS by sending an MMS, an SMS or a Vox MMS message.

😺 To se

To send text only, it is advisable to use an SMS.

Should the sending fail, the mobile will resend it automatically  $^{(0)}$ . The  $\stackrel{(1)}{\textcircled{2}}$  icon will appear at the bottom of your screen each time an automatic attempt is made to send the message.



In your "Unsent" messages box, the rightarrow icon will indicate that the automatic sending procedure is activated.

Should the message fail completely, you will be notified by a message. In your "**Unsent**" messages box, the icon will indicate that the MMS could not be sent. By selecting it and pressing OK, you can send it again, modify it or delete it.

#### <sup>(I)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability.

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#### 7.4.3 Creating and sending a voice message ("Voice/Vox MMS")

Go to the "Create message" menu, if necessary, from the "Messages" function and select "Voice/Vox MMS". You can send a message quickly using the "Voice/Vox MMS" function without writing. The recipient is not disturbed and simply receives a normal MMS <sup>(I)</sup>. You can reply to any message using a "Voice/Vox MMS".

#### 7.5 Data entry system

To facilitate writing messages, your phone is equipped with a predictive text input system <sup>(2)</sup>. To form a word, simply <u>press the key once</u> for each of the letters in that word. The cursor shape varies depending on the input mode selected:

- In predictive input mode
- In normal mode

To confirm a word and insert a space, push the  $\triangleleft \triangleright$  key to the right or press the  $\diamondsuit$  key downwards or press the (in) key.

The letter displayed may not always correspond to the desired letter; the system suggests the most common word. Do not worry about the words initially suggested; keep on typing, the system will make better suggestions as you continue to input letters.

  Predictive: View words proposed by the dictionary that include a sign or punctuation mark such as an apostrophe, @, dash, etc.

You have a personal dictionary which allows you to add <sup>(1)</sup>, modify or delete words. While writing a message, you can add a word by pressing the **OK** key and by selecting "**Add word**".

#### 7.6 Message settings

Press OK in the message menu and using the navigation key, select the 🕎 icon.

7.6.1 Sending param.

You can program the following parameters:

<sup>(I)</sup> Contact your network operator.

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#### I-Text/SMS

- Service centre ("SC") <sup>(1)</sup>: phone number of your operator's service centre (it may be automatically provided).
- E-mail centre ("EC") <sup>(1)</sup>: the number of the server for sending e-mails (it may be automatically provided).
- Ack. receipt ("Ack"): request for acknowledgement of receipt for each message sent.
- Message validity ("Val"): the time period during which attempts to send the message to the recipient will be repeated in case of failure.
- Format ("Typ"): format to be used for delivery of message to recipient (SMS, fax, etc.).
- Memory ("Mem"): phone or SIM (see page 40).

#### 2-Multimedia/MMS

- **MMS profiles ("Profile")** <sup>(1)</sup>: To set your MMS profile, follow the same procedure as for setting your WAP connection (cf. page 65).
- Mode: this option allows you to choose between immediate reception or deferred mode for national and international network coverage (see page 30).
- Acknowledgment of receipt ("Ack"): request for acknowledgement of receipt for each message sent.
- Message validity ("Val"): the time period during which attempts to send the message to the recipient will be repeated in case of failure.
- Memory ("Mem"): to store or automatically delete your sent messages as you choose.
- **Timer**: allows you to set the speed at which the pages scroll through: the recipient will see the message at this speed.

#### 7.6.2 How your messages are saved

By selecting the "**Mem.**" option in the "**Sending param.**" menu, you have 3 ways of handling your messages (see page 39):

#### I-Sent messages:

- Save the messages in your SIM card (SMS only),
- Save the message in your telephone's memory (SMS and MMS),
- Send your messages without saving them. You will not be able to read them later (messages are SMS, MMS, Vox MMS).

#### 2-Received messages:

- Short messages (SMS) are always saved in the SIM card memory,
- Multimedia messages are always saved in the telephone's memory,
- You can save your messages (SMS/MMS) in the "**Archives**" folder of your inbox. All archived messages (SMS or MMS) will be stored systematically in the telephone's memory.

#### 7.6.3 Creating a group

Select the "Add group" item, confirm using the OK key, then name the group. You can now enter the phone numbers for the members of your new group.

#### 7.6.4 Deleting messages

To delete all messages on your SIM card or in the Archives go to the "**Sending param.**" menu and select the following options:

- "Delete SIM msg.": delete all messages received and sent from the SIM.
- "Delete prod. msg.": delete all messages stored in the phone's memory.

Your SIM card's capacity depends on your operator. The 🞇 icon appears when the card is full.
To receive new SMS, delete some old ones.

<sup>(I)</sup> Contact your operator for details to fill in these fields.

# 8 Customise ..... 💬

From the main screen, select the icon menu  $\bigcirc$  and select the function of your choice in order to customise your telephone.

#### **8.1** Ringtones

#### **Available functions**

To modify the sound settings, adjust using the **<>** key:

 $\mathbf{Q}$  Select a melody using the  $\frac{1}{2}$  key then confirm by pressing OK.

- Mode (normal, discreet, vibrator...).
- 📢 🗄 Adjust the volume using the 🖕 key.
- Select the type of key beep.
- Select a melody for a new incoming message.
- Select a melody for a new incoming appointment.
- Select a melody for a new incoming alarm.

This mode may be deactivated when using certain accessories (full duplex hands-free car kit...).

#### **8.2** Atmospheres

The "**Atmospheres**" menu allows you to customise your telephone to suit your own taste. In one go, you can modify 7 customisable items. To access this menu from the main screen, press **OK** and select the "**Customise**" item with the navigation key. Press **OK** once more then choose the "**Atmospheres**" menu.

Silence

An Atmosphere comprises:

- 4 visual items: ON screen image/animation
  - OFF screen image/animation
  - Main screen image/animation
  - Skins and colours



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3 sound items:

- I melody for incoming calls

- I melody when the telephone is switched on
- I melody for notification of incoming messages

When using for the first time, a default Atmosphere is activated.

Even if you choose an Atmosphere, you can still modify the elements in it one by one (see pages 44-45). You can reactivate an Atmosphere at any time.

When changing Atmosphere, an installation screen appears:



## Wait for the 7 elements to be installed.

The installation of the Atmosphere can be stopped and cancelled if you receive an incoming call or if you press the  $\subset$  key. In this case, the previous choice of Atmosphere is kept.

#### 8.3 Main screen

The main screen is displayed after your telephone has been switched on and/or when no functions are being used (calls, sending of short messages...).

You can lock and unlock the keypad by making a long keypress on the  $\stackrel{\longleftarrow}{\longleftarrow}$  key.

You can access the directory directly from the main screen by pressing the  $\checkmark$  key, access messages by pressing the  $\blacktriangle$  key, or the Album by pressing the  $\triangleleft$  key to the left or right.

By selecting the "**Main screen**" you can customise it by replacing the default image or animation displayed on your telephone.

### 8.4 Colours

This function enables you to customise the graphic style and the colours of your telephone (menu screens, entry screens etc.)

To access this function, press **OK** from the "**Customise**" menu then select "**Colours**" with the navigation key.

## 8.5 Tone maker

#### 8.5.1 Compose

Select "Compose" then use the keypad as shown below:



#### 8.5.2 Save

Select "Save" then save a sound to use it as a melody.

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## 8.6 ON/OFF screens

You can customise your welcome message, animation, melody or image that appears when you switch on your telephone.

You can also customise your OFF screen with an image or animation.

### 8.7 Energy saver

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- You can choose whether to activate this function or not:
- Deactivated: the main screen remains displayed.
- Activated: a new screen appears after a few seconds displaying the following information: clock, battery charge, signal strength.
- By default, the economy mode is activated.
  - We advise you to stay in economy mode to maximise your telephone's autonomy.

## 8.8 Zoom <sup>(1)</sup>

Two character sizes are available for your telephone screen. Large characters is selected by default. If you wish to display more information select "**Zoom**".

## 8.9 Customising the keys (1)

#### 8.9.1 Action key (1)

This key has predefined functions, which vary from one model to another (operator services, games access, or Games & Applications). You can customise it for long and short keypresses, giving it the functions that you wish. For example, it can be used a as a shortcut to access the Diary, to write a message,...

#### 8.9.2 Keypad

By customising your keys, you can call someone or access a function directly from the main screen.

To programme a key on your keypad, select "**Keypad**" and choose the key that you wish to programme. Then select "**Numbers**" if you wish to programme a direct call or "**Function**" if you wish to assign a specific function to the selected key.

## 8.10 Voice commands

Voice commands allow you to access one of the menu functions by pronouncing the name of that function.

#### Recording a voice command

In order to record a voice command for one of the menu functions, select "**Voice Command**" and the desired function and then follow the instructions.

#### <sup>(1)</sup> Depending on the language.

#### <sup>(I)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability.

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The functions for which a voice command has been recorded are indicated by the  $\mathbb{R}^{1}$  icon. There are 10 functions accessible through voice recognition.

#### Using a voice command

You activate "**voice commands**" by a long keypress on the **{**] key from the main screen. To use a voice command, follow the instructions on the screen.

After recording, you can "Listen to", "Replace" or "Delete" a recorded voice recognition command.

## 8.11 Menu display

Select a menu display by choosing from the three options proposed.

Save your telephone number (usually written on your SIM card), type in the number and confirm by pressing OK.

Modify the number to access your voice mail.

## 9.1 Diary

Your phone has a sophisticated diary that will help you to manage your daily schedule. You can also save "to do" lists.

#### **Consulting your diary**

Three views are possible. You must first choose the appropriate icon:

- Daily view
- Weekly view
- Monthly view
- To do" list.
- **E** Parameters

You can scroll through the dates by pressing the  $\frac{1}{2}$  key.

According to the view you can read, create, modify or send an item.

#### Creating an appointment and programming an alarm

When you create an appointment ("**Create**" option), you can also activate an alarm. You can set the desired alarm activation time in accordance with your appointment time.

Scroll to the  $\overrightarrow{\mathbb{B}}$  icon using the  $\triangleleft \triangleright$  key, and confirm using the OK key. Select "**Select type**", then confirm once again using the OK key and enter the type of task to be performed ("to do" or call appointment), then enter the purpose.

This list can be arranged by deadline or by priority. To do this, scroll to the  $\Xi$  icon using the  $\triangleleft \triangleright$  key, then confirm using the  $\Diamond K$  key.

You can set an alarm for a task for which you have set a due date. This alarm will sound on the chosen day at the time that you entered.

#### **Configure the diary**

## 9.2 Alarms

#### Alarm clock

First set the alarm frequency (daily or only once), then enter the time and date and confirm by pressing the OK. If desired, you can also enter the purpose of the alarm and then confirm with the OK key or press the bottom of the  $\triangleq$  key.

#### Timer

Set the amount of time desired before the alarm is to sound and confirm with the OK key.

#### Options

When the alarm sounds, the  $\mathfrak{V}$  icon is displayed on the main screen. The alarm will sound whether the handset is switched on or off and can be shut off by pressing any key.

If you have chosen the "Snooze" option, the alarm will go off at regular 10 minute intervals.

#### **9.3 Converter**

The currency converter allows you to:

- Convert a currency directly into euros and vice versa <sup>(1)</sup>.
- · Convert a sum of money into another currency (e.g. dollars to pounds).

For a conversion into euros, you can modify the default currency by selecting "Set up".

If converting between international currencies, both currencies must be selected. You must also enter the appropriate exchange rate.

An exchange rate value is pre-set for each currency. You can change this value by selecting "Set up".



From the main screen, enter the amount in euros to be converted into the programmed currency, then press the OK key and select "**Converter**".

#### 9.4 Calculator



Enter a number and confirm with the OK key, then select the type of operation to be performed using the  $\blacklozenge$  key and confirm again.

Enter the second number and press OK.

Select the "=" sign to display the result.

To return to the main screen, press the C key (long keypress).

## 9.5 Clock

You can display two clocks (local and remote) at the same time.

To program a local clock, you can first choose to activate automatic transition to daylight saving time; then to manage time zones by selecting a city on the world map using the navigation key. If you use two clocks, you have the option of selecting and then renaming a city for the local clock from the world map. You can then repeat the same operation for the remote clock.

#### Programming the dual time display

Go to the "Clock type" icon 🕥 and select the "2 clocks" option.

#### **Display format**

You can display your clock in analogue or digital format and the date in the following formats: day/month/year, month/date/year or year/month/day in digits or using the first three letters for the day and month.

#### 9.6 Memory

#### View available memory space.

Your telephone's memory is shared between several functions: directory, diary, messages, voice messages, voice recognition, images and melodies. For example, if you use a lot of memory for your voice memos, you will have less memory available for the directory.

Do not forget to delete large items such as voice memos, MMS, images, photos, recorded sounds, applications..., in order to free up memory space. You can also delete certain items included in your telephone when you bought it.

## 9.7 Voice memo

The voice memo feature acts as a Dictaphone and enables you to record personal messages. To record a voice memo, select "**Voice memo**", then "**Save**", and begin speaking after the beep. Once the voice memo has been created, you can access the following options:

## 9.8 Infrared

Your phone's infrared feature allows you to exchange contacts and diary data via an infrared link. The infrared port is situated on the left hand side of your telephone.

#### Sending data

To send data, select the directory file, then select the "**Data transfer**" option. It is not necessary to activate the infrared feature before sending.

#### **Receiving data**

To receive data, you must activate the infrared feature. A message will advise you of the arrival of data; you then save the data by pressing the OK key or reject it using the C key.

Once you have selected the option, the  $\overline{a}$  icon appears at the bottom of your screen. Infrared will be deactivated automatically after a short while <sup>(1)</sup>. The connection will cut off if you have an incoming call. You can receive up to three calling cards or appointments at the same time.

#### 9.9 Alarms list

You can view all the alarms that you have set. The  $\mathfrak{V}$  icon will appear on your main screen if the alarm clock or the timer have been set, or if the alarm is set for the current day or the following day.

You have access to all events that occurred on your telephone during your absence, and which you have not yet consulted.



**Unanswered calls**: Display the numbers <sup>(1)</sup> of the people who tried to reach you in your absence (See page 20).

- Messages ("Msg. Received"): allows you to access the messages that you have received (See page 28).
- **Voice Mail**: allows you to access the voice messages that you have received (See page 17).

WAP alerts (1): view information sent over WAP.

## **II.I Access WAP services**

WAP (Wireless Application Protocol) is a service that allows you to access the mobile Internet. Thanks to WAP, you can obtain information such as: weather conditions, stock market information, traffic information, etc.

The "**Homepage**" option launches the WAP browser on the homepage of the default profile if it has been configured.

The "Bookmarks" option allows you to access the list of your favourite sites and add to them.

The "**Profiles**" option allows you to program the connection parameters for your WAP services access provider. In most cases, the connection parameters for your browser will have already been filled in <sup>(2)</sup>.

The "Enter address" option allows you to directly access the WAP page for which you enter the URL address.

The "Push Mode" option (1) allows you to set the different Push modes.

- <sup>(1)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability.
- <sup>(2)</sup> Contact your operator to obtain the necessary information for the WAP/GPRS connection parameters.

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<sup>(1)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability depending on your model.

## **1.2** Available options

You can access the options in three different ways. You can either select the  $\bigotimes$  icon (to the left of the title) and press **OK**, or confirm "**Options**", or by pressing *im* (long keypress) when reading a page.

- Profile name
- Homepage
- IP address
- Security
- Bearer choice (GPRS/GSM, GPRS, GSM)
- Push parameters
- Validate

If you have selected the **GPRS** transmission mode, you must fill in the following parameters:

- Authentication <sup>(1)</sup> (user name and password)
- APN (2)

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If you selected the **GSM** transmission mode, you must fill in the following parameters:

If you selected the GPRS/GSM transmission mode, you must fill in both the GPRS and GSM parameters.

#### **11.4 Direct access/profile access**

By selecting **Customisation/Settings/WAP/GPRS**, you can access the menu that will allow you to change the launch parameters for your WAP service.

- **Direct access:** when you launch WAP from the main screen, you go <u>directly</u> to the WAP homepage specified by the default profile.
- Profile access: when you launch WAP from the main screen, you will see the following screen:



## **II.5 GPRS** function

Your mobile phone has an efficient high-speed modem based on GPRS technology <sup>(1)</sup>. With this modem your will be able to surf faster on the WAP and send your MMS more quickly. This service may be billed at a different rate (contact your operator for more information).

You can only use the GPRS function if:

- I) the service is developed by your operator,
- 2) if your subscription includes the GPRS option,
- 3) if the profiles have been entered and the transmission mode selected is set to GPRS or GPRS/GSM (see page 66),

The **EFRE** icon appears when the GPRS context is active.

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# 2 Media Album .....

## **12.1** Album menu

To access the Album from the main screen, press the navigation key to the left or to the right **<>**. The Album is a function that groups together all visual and sound items in your telephone, regardless of whether they are embedded, downloaded, recorded or composed.

This function comprises two menus:

- the images album, containing images, icons, photos etc... and
- the sounds album, containing sounds and melodies.

## 12.2 My images

You can select an image or a photo and use it as the main screen, the ON/OFF screen. You may change it, send it by MMS or assign it to a contact in the directory using the "Assign image" option (cf. page 25).

The Images album is made up of the following folders:

- General: list of all images (built-in or created) from all album folders.
- **Photos** <sup>(1)</sup>: default folder for pictures taken with the camera.
- **Images**: contains all images not belonging in one of the other folders.
- Icons: contains EMS, stamps...
- **Frames**: contains frames for enhancing your images.

For easier searching, the images/photos are displayed on the screen in reduced size. To view one image at a time, select an image, press **OK** and click on **"View**".

Then, from this view you can scroll through the images by making a short keypress on  $\blacklozenge$ . A long keypress will start the slide show.

## 12.3 My Sounds

You can choose a sound for the ON/OFF screen, for an incoming call, for a message alert or for an alarm (see page 41).

The "My Sounds" Album is made up of the following folders (1):

- General (contains all sound items (built-in or created) from all album folders),
- Melodies,
- Crazy sounds,
- **Recorded sounds** (only contains recordings made with the "**Record**" function and the "**Memo=melo**" function),
- **Composed sounds** (only contains compositions made using "Compose").

You can search any Images or Sounds file by pressing the key bearing the first character of the filename.

# **3 Camera** (One Touch 735 and 735i only) ..... **©**

Your phone is equipped with a camera for capturing a landscape, friends, family etc. You can record them in your "**Media album**". You can also use one of your photos to:

- send it to your friends in a multimedia message (MMS) to a mobile or an e-mail address (see page 36).
- customise the main screen (see page 43),
- customise the ON/OFF screen (see page 45),
- assign it to a contact in your directory (see page 25),
- modify it as your mood takes you (add a frame, stamp, see page 78),
- transfer it to your computer using Alcatel's PC software suite.

To access this function from the main screen, press **OK**, then using the navigation key select "**Camera**" or press the right soft key directly. You then go straight to the photo shot screen.

## **13.1** Taking a photo

Your phone must be switched on to take a photo. The screen acts as viewfinder. Position the object or landscape in the viewfinder and press OK or the action key O. To take the picture, the lens is situated on the back of the phone. Please do not touch it. To the left of the lens there is a mirror to make sure you a well placed in order to take a photo of yourself.

#### Taking a photo with sound

"Send postcards with sounds", you can record a background sound, while you are taking a picture. To do so, keep your finger pressed down on the  $\bigcirc$  or  $\bigotimes$  key when taking the photo. A screen will ask you to record your sound. If you release your finger, the recording will stop. Press  $\subset$  to return to the photo shot screen.

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Just after taking the photo, you can rotate the image with the  $\triangleleft$  key or reduce the image size with the key (for certain formats).

Please use your camera sensibly. Respect others and observe current regulations in your country.

## **13.2 Settings**

Before taking the photo, you can adjust a number of settings. Access settings directly:



Access the settings from the MENU: From the photo shot screen, press the right soft key to access the following options:

#### 13.2.1 Image size

Select "**Image size**" in the list of options Alternatively, you may continuously press the PP key until you reach the size you require: CIF (352x288), Panoramic (352x128) optimalised to be sent to a PC, L (128x128 pixels) for local use or MMS, M (64x64) to assign it to a directory file, S (32x32), XS (16x16) to create your very own stamps (see page 79).

#### 13.2.2 Capture mode

Select "**Capture mode**" in the options list or keep pressing the select the following modes:

**1** Single: a single photo; this is the default mode.

- Animation x 4: in this mode, you can take 4 consecutive photos like a small video clip. The number at the top right of the screen shows you which photo your are on: 1/4, 2/4, ....4/4. When you have taken the 4th photo, the animation will start automatically.
- **Mosaic**: in this mode, you will get an image made up of 4 thumbnails. To do this, proceed as for the animation, once the "**Mosaic**" has been selected (see above).

#### 13.2.3 Frame

Choose a frame from the list offered and press **OK**: the frame will be placed in your photo shot screen; if the image is to your liking, press **OK** to take the photo. You will also find this option in the "**Modify**" function (see page 78).



#### 13.2.4 Quality

Select "Quality" in the list of options or access it directly by pressing the 🐽, 💩, 🛥 keys:

eco Economy quality: memory space is optimized,

**Standard quality:** compromise between size and quality,

high High quality: excellent quality to be sent to a PC.

Auto: the settings adjust automatically (no icon will be displayed on your screen),

- 🖏 cloudy,
- C night time,
- indoors/artificial light.

#### 13.2.7 Colour

You can choose from 5 colour effects: Colour, Black and White, Sepia, Negative, Outlined. You can access this option directly from the taking photo screen by pressing the left soft key.

#### 13.2.8 Access to album

This option enables you to access the "Album/Images" menu directly.

**13.2.9** Folder by default

You can change the folder where your photos will be stored automatically.

2 You can create your own folders using the "Album/Image" function (see page 69).

13.2.10 Other direct access options from the photo shot screen

**Exposure**: adjust the contrast of your photo with the navigation key: to the left = overexposure, to the right = underexposure.

**Zoom**: activate the zoom with the up/down navigation key: up: zoom in, down: zoom out. If you keep the key pressed in, the zoom will be gradual (this option does not apply to CIF and Panoramic sizes).

Landscape mode: take photos in "Portrait" or "Landscape" mode: you can rotate the photo with the navigation key before sending it (see page 77).

# 4 Modifying images .....

This option enables you to reduce image size, or to add stamps or frames. You have two possibilities for accessing images in order to modify them:

- Via the "Album" menu: Choose an image, press OK and select "Modify".
- Via the "**Camera**" menu <sup>(1)</sup>:

After taking the photo, press the right soft key to access "Options" and select "Modify".

From these two modes, you have access to the following 3 functions: reduce size, add stamps, add frames.

**Reduce size**: this function enables you to choose the format that fits your needs. You can use an image as a decorative stamp or obtain a minimum file size (e.g.: send by MMS). After selecting "**Reduce**", press OK. The following screens will be displayed:

# 2 Troubleshooting ...... Before contacting the after-sales service, we advise you to perform the following checks:

#### My mobile phone does not switch on

- Press C until the screen comes on
- Check the battery charge level
- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your telephone back on

#### My phone does not respond since several minutes

- Press the C key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then switch the phone back on

#### My screen is difficult to read

- Clean your screen
- Check the contrast
- Activate the backlighting
- Use your mobile phone in accordance with the recommended conditions of use

#### My mobile phone's backlighting will not turn off

• Press (long keypress) the ໜ key

#### My mobile phone turns off by itself

- · Check that your keypad is locked when you are not using your mobile phone
- Check the battery charge level
- · Make sure the backlighting is not permanently activated

#### The mobile phone vibrates even when there is no incoming call
